## Legislative Updates

## Congresswoman Brownley: Robert McDonald reported

- The Congresswoman is in DC currently and is eager to vote on a COVID relief bill
- They are also addressing any USPS issues that come up

## Congressman Garcia: Charles Navarro reported

- The House passed a continuing resolution for funding until the end of the year
- The Congressman signed a discharge petition to release unspent PPP fund
- The Congressman hosted USDA undersecretary re: wildfires
- He met with Dr. Peplinksi to hear concerns related to school districts
- They are still trying to keep the relief bill moving

### Assemblymember Smith: Ryan Valencia reported

- End of the session was on August 31<sup>st</sup>
- They passed a number of bills, including the negotiated tenant relief package (AB 3088)
- The best place to look for updates is covid19.ca.gov
- A lot of bills the Assembly member authored or co-authored were signed including AB 3267
- The Free Clinic of Simi Valley was announced as the District 38 Non Profit of the Year
- They are continuing to complete casework, including DMV and EDD claims
- The \$300 extra for UI has been approved and is working through the EDD

### City of Simi Valley: Samantha Argabrite reported

- They had their first city council meeting with a zoom public hearing this week
- The city released the Small Business Grant program and Rental Relief Assistance program

# Rancho Simi Recreation and Park District: Elaine Freeman

- Elaine thanked the state legislature for AB 2257 which relieves restrictions of AB 5 on contract employees, which has been helpful for special districts
- The district received a \$1M grant to help with the Arroyo project

# U.S. Chamber of Commerce: Jennings Imel reported

- CR passed to fund the government through 12/11
- Senate will be busy with court nominations and the Supreme Court nomination

- Need another COVID relief package
- Most businesses need another round of funding, and also liability protections
- There is a big move to have the house bring up the bill, and the "problem solver" caucus presented their own package

# Southern California Edison: Rudy Gonzales reported

- Wildfire mitigation work is still being done; they are trying to do as much work as they can in the evenings or overnight to minimize disruptions
- They won't be cutting off service for nonpayment during the pandemic
- The rotating blackouts were something that happened statewide with the power grid due to the excessive heat; unfortunately led to SCE customers experiencing outages

## Calleguas Municipal Water District: Dan Drugan reported

• Started filming on LA/Madera to profile the transformation of the welcome corner area. The city staff are getting a 36K rebate from Metropolitan Water District for the project

### **CSUCI:** Celina Zacarias reported

- The school will be virtual in Spring 2021; they are hoping to open the campus up for June 2021
- The professors and instructors have done a great job in preparing for virtual learning
- The new chancellor of the CSU system will be announced today
- If anyone is having struggles with the CSU system and virtual learning, they are encouraged to reach out to the respective university

### Simi Valley Chamber of Commerce: Samantha Shapiro reported

- Chamber continues to urge support for a new federal relief package including additional rounds of benefits for businesses and liability protection
- The Candidate Forum will be on September 30 & October 1
- The Voter's Guide has been released and is available on the website
- The chamber took positions on 5 different ballot measures
- The Chamber continues to meet with the Task Force on Business Recovery to advocate for our businesses to safely reopen and to support those who are opened
